around for a while & as in all ~~cases~~

past & the second section is reintroduced
although the whole mood is slightly
subdued on this occasion. Suddenly
there is a drastic change & three
chords lay down the basis for
the fourth & last part, ~~for it seems~~
~~that~~ an unexpected intruder
coming to seal the fate of man's
life on earth, for it is the
beginning of a new ice age. As
the music builds the glaciers

slowly at first begin to move
from both poles towards the equator,
but the movement grows quicker
with the introduction of the solo
drums, during which the earth is

some triumphant solo guitar which
